Chicago Baseball Museum Aligns with White Sox Team Physicians

Museum finds new home at Midwest Orthopaedics at Rush



Chicago, IL – The Chicago Baseball Museum (CBM) recently embarked on the next phase of development with the establishment of new office space in River City, the current home of Chicago White Sox team physicians, Midwest Orthopaedics at Rush (MOR). The new location will be staffed full-time and will provide direct access to the White Sox physicians and MOR personnel.

The CBM will create, manage, and implement a strategic plan to bring players lost to other sports and activities back to baseball by providing the necessary equipment and education on game history, injury prevention, performance health, and steroid abuse – all part of founder, Dr. David

Fletcher's expertise as a preventive medicine/occupational medicine specialist.

“The association with Midwest Orthopaedics is another way for the Museum to build and expand its presence in Chicago's baseball community,” said Chicago Baseball Museum President and graduate of Rush University's Medical College, Dr. David Fletcher.

Midwest Orthopaedics at Rush is widely recognized as the regional leader in comprehensive orthopaedic services and their physicians are the official team doctors for the Chicago White Sox, the Chicago Bulls and the DePaul Blue Demons.

The Chicago Baseball Museum is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that will collect, preserve, document, research, and interpret artifacts and events that are associated with the legacy, evolution and contemporary life of Chicago baseball. The CBM will strive to become the central network for baseball in Chicago by providing a safe and neutral environment for children to celebrate and promote baseball. Through free coaching clinics, league play, tournaments, and a comprehensive educational program, the CBM will become the epicenter of Chicago baseball for kids.
